1) By relating to God not by way of performance which can be exhausting and unsettling but by grace.



Ann Voskamp: "Honestly, we really don't want a Christmas that we have to produce, or perform, or perfect – we want a Christmas that holds us – that revives us, remakes us. We want a Christmas that whispers JESUS. A Christmas that restores and restories us with a new story, especially this year.
