


#### 2 Corinthians 13

"Your restoration is what we pray for."





#### 2 Corinthians 13:1-14:

This is the third time I am coming to you. Every charge must be established by the evidence of two or three witnesses. I warned those who sinned before and all the others, and I warn them now while absent, as I did when present on my second visit, that if I come again I will not spare them— ...

since you seek proof that Christ is speaking in me. He is not weak in dealing with you, but is powerful among you. For he was crucified in weakness, but lives by the power of God. For we also are weak in him, but in dealing with you we will live with him by the power of God. ...

Examine yourselves, to see whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Or do you not realize this about yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?—unless indeed you fail to meet the test! I hope you will find out that we have not failed the test. ...

But we pray to God that you may not do wrong—not that we may appear to have met the test, but that you may do what is right, though we may seem to have failed. For we cannot do anything against the truth, but only for the truth. For we are glad when we are weak and you are strong. Your restoration is what we pray for. ... For this reason I write these things while I am away from you, that when I come I may not have to be severe in my use of the authority that the Lord has given me for building up and not for tearing down. ...

Finally, brothers, rejoice. Aim for restoration, comfort one another, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the saints greet you. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

### 3 Thoughts on Restoration:

1. What to know about restoration that is challenging and hard:

It entails firm engagement that must be rooted in the gospel.

Firm Engagement...

# Firm Engagement...rooted in the GOSPEL

Verses 3-4: ...since you seek proof that Christ is speaking in me. He is not weak in dealing with you, but is powerful among you. For he was crucified in weakness, but lives by the power of God. For we also are weak in him, but in dealing with you we will live with him by the power of God.



Love and discipline are not contradictory.

"Redemptive pain that protects from destructive pain"

"I've been really hurt and crushed by harsh correction. Is this what the Apostle Paul is doing?"

The goal is to build up not tear down.

Verse 10: For this reason I write these things while I am away from you, that when I come I may not have to be severe in my use of the authority that the Lord has given me for building up and not for tearing down.

"Examine yourselves"

Verses 5-8: Examine yourselves, to see whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Or do you not realize this about yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?—unless indeed you fail to meet the test! I hope you will find out that we have not failed the test. ...

But we pray to God that you may not do wrong—not that we may appear to have met the test, but that you may do what is right, though we may seem to have failed. For we cannot do anything against the truth, but only for the truth.

## Scripture calls for self examination:

Psalm 26:2: Prove me, O LORD, and try me; test my heart and my mind.

Lamentations 3:40: Let us examine and probe our ways, and let us return to the Lord.

1 Corinthians 11:28: Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup.

How to test ourselves:


Ask, "Is Jesus in me?" (verse 5)

Matthew 28:19-20, Galatians 2:20

How do I know if Jesus is in me?

a) Repentance

b) A passion for God's glory that you care most about

With restoration, have you ever tweaked the truth in order to look better than you are? Have you ever been afraid to confront someone because you don't that person to be upset at you?

Why do we do that? Because we are more concerned about our approval than anything else.
