

Hold Fast: "to be diligent, cling to, to take firm hold of."

In English, hold fast is a nautical term that is connected to the Dutch words "houd vast", which means "hold tight" in regards to holding securely to the ship's ropes and rigging.

To the degree our hearts are gripped by the *greatness* of the One who holds us fast, we will by God's grace live a life that holds fast as the writer exhorts us to in this letter. We will be anchored by the living hope, firm and secure (Heb 6:19).


