Week 5 - Oct 19 - Missions Break:

Together for Our City: "Welcome One Another" (Romans 14–15)

Welcome & Opening Prayer

Pray for the Spirit's help to:

- Receive one another as Christ has received us (Rom 15:7).
- Grow in harmony so that "with one voice" we glorify God (Rom 15:5–6).
- Live out John 17:21—our unity as a witness to a divided world.

Sermon Debrief: Open Share

- What image, line, or story stuck with you (e.g., London's diversity;
 Parliament chapel; "unity in diversity like an orchestra")—and why?
- Where did the Lord nudge or encourage you personally?

Read the Text Aloud: Romans 14:1–9, 10–13; 15:1–7 (one or two readers)

A. Unity in a Divided Church

Key Idea: A divided world needs a united church. Our unity is both our witness and our worship.

- How does Paul call both sides—the "weak" and the "strong"—to relate to one another (see vv. 3–4, 10–13)?
- Where do you tend to lean—more cautious or more free—and how might you show grace toward those who differ from you?
- Where do you notice fragmentation among believers in our city or even within the church? How could visible, relational unity make Jesus more believable to those watching?

B. The Gospel Word: "Welcome" (Gk: "Proslambanō")

Key Idea: "Welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you."

- What's the difference between tolerating someone and truly welcoming them into your heart?
- How does remembering how Christ welcomed you—undeservedly and joyfully—reshape how you relate to believers from different traditions or backgrounds?

C. Unity in Diversity & the Cost of Love

Key Idea: Unity doesn't mean uniformity—it's unity in diversity, sustained by sacrificial love.

- What might it cost you—time, comfort, preference—to welcome believers who differ from you?
- Identify one concrete way to "bear with" someone this month (Romans 15:1–2).

D. Together for Our City

Key Idea: One mind, one voice, one mission.

- What might "one mind and one voice" look like in San Diego's churches?
- Brainstorm one tangible way our group could partner with another church or ministry in the next 60 days—through prayer, service, or mercy.

Soft Accountability — Next Steps (last 5 min)

Each person names one step for the week:

- Welcome: Who will you intentionally welcome across difference?
- Bear With: What preference will you lay down to build another up?
- Witness: How could your posture of unity point someone to Jesus?

Closing Prayer

Read Romans 15:5–7 aloud together. Pray that Redeemer—and the wider church in our city—would become a living preview of heaven's diverse worship (Revelation 7:9–10).

This Week's Practice (Optional)

- **Hospitality of Heart:** Meet one believer from a different background (age, ethnicity, denomination, or style). Listen, pray, and encourage.
- **Scripture:** Pray John 17:20–23 daily; memorize Romans 15:7.
- Reflection: Each night ask, "Where did I welcome as Christ welcomed me—and where did I judge or withdraw?"
